Due to availability of spare parts and the internet in Singapore, laptops are currently being sent back to Singapore for refurbishment.

So since May 2023, a few of us have been refurbishing pre-used laptops donated by generous well-wishers. We use our God-given gifts to upgrade these laptops to modern-day performance levels. This facilitates learning for 800 students, providing computer literacy for their future careers.

For instance, while on a mission trip to Banda Aceh, Indonesia just after the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami to support the rebuilding efforts, I saw how the Christians would travel up to 50km before dawn just to meet us for morning devotion.

It opened my eyes on how much I could learn from them as a Christian. Such life-changing lessons and insights are difficult to experience here in comfortable and safe Singapore.

I have yet to visit Timor-Leste, but I would like to do so one day. With SPMS looking to build a computer lab, hopefully that would be my chance!
