In my first year as a dental student, I joined 2 medical mission trips that opened my eyes to the dire oral health conditions of the locals in Cambodia. There were children with entire mouths full of cavities.

Being young dental students back then, there was very little we could do, so that sense of helplessness eventually spurred us on to start our own dental mission project.

The initial years of Project Sabai Dental were focused on providing dental services to underprivileged communities in Cambodia.

When we started in 2008, we were operating in two Don Bosco schools in Cambodia. The project subsequently expanded to involve a total of seven schools, including those in Timor-Leste.

Over the years, our focus has shifted away from a predominantly treatment-based model. The current approach aims to target oral health diseases through a school-based oral health education and fluoride preventive programme.

By empowering the teachers and administrators of our partnering schools, we hope to improve the oral health of the children studying there.

In 2018, 10 years since we first started, our team also decided to officially form a society, Project Sabai Dental Society (Singapore).

We do not actively preach the gospel on our trips. However, as many of us are Christians, we do spend some time in fellowship especially with the missionaries in those countries.

We also live in a way that reflects the Bible's teachings, with the intention of leading by example for our juniors and dental students. We keep the project secular so that non-Christians can join us as we live out our beliefs. _____••••_

When it comes to missions, I believe that your availability is more important than your ability. Missions is a journey we make together with God, an invitation to join Him in His plans.

It is less of what we do and the tangible deliverables. Instead, it is about obedience and walking closely with Him.
